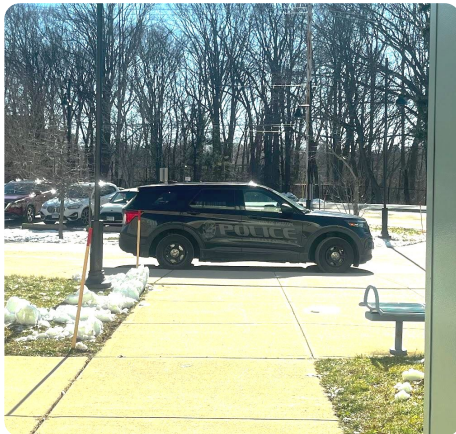
Yes, but: An automated audio announcement that is meant

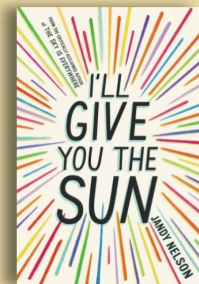
